As I mentioned on the call, I was involved in many AARs in the many years I was with the Bureau of Reclamation. These were extremely useful endeavors and went well beyond just assessing what worked and what didn't. An AAR can be as detailed and in-depth as the situation warrants. For example, an AAR on a dam safety issue was very detailed and indepth because there are human safety issues tied to dam safety. But we also did them for major projects such as EISs.

But, an incredibly important aspect of a good AAR is using what comes out of it and formally adopting the recommendations. Can't just put together a really good list of "worked/didn't work" items. What comes from the AAR must be used to enhance, improve and shape what comes next. Thus, a good AAR on the LCC concept, LCC Network, and individual LCCs can and should be useful in shaping "it is going to look different coming out the other side."

I wasn't a FWS employee during the days of Ecosystem Management but I know from working with states as an LCC Coordinator that the states in this LCC really didn't like EM. In fact, when I started this job I was told by the PPP LCC Co-Chair, a State Director, the he thought LCCs were just EM in disguise. Point is, if we had done a really good job of an AAR on EM back in the day we might have shaped LCCs differently.

OK - sermon on AARs over. I'll leave you with my willingness to actively engage with anyone interested to undertake an AAR, AAcASS or whatever we want to call it.
